Delve into the history of San Antonio as you visit the Alamo, est. 1718, one of five missions built along the San Antonio River. The Mission San Jose, built in 1720, and famous for its Rose Window, is the best example of restored missions in the U.S. Mission Conception, with the original frescos still visible in some of the rooms, is the oldest stone church in our nation. A stop at El Mercado, where you can shop for bargains among colorful Mexican imports.

Visit the Japanese Sunken Gardens built in a beautiful and architecturally unique old stone quarry. It is renowned for its beautiful foliage and flowers. The Spanish Governor's Palace, built in 1749, is full of artifacts and furnishings which reflect the roll it played in San Antonio's history. There is a beautiful garden adjoining the palace. The San Fernando Cathedral is called the "heart of San Antonio" by many. The original walls still form the sanctuary. There will be a boat

ride on the romantic San Antonio River which is lush with tropical foliage.
